## Charlotte-Metrolina MOAA Chapter Minutes for April 17, 2016

President Ron Morgan called the meeting to order at 3:29 p.m. at the Red Rocks Café. The invocation was given by Chaplain John Samb and was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Ron welcomed all guests and members. The 50/50 Raffle of \$37.00 was won by Chuck Martin. The minutes for the March 20, 2016 meeting were approved without changes. Ron Wilsbach, Treasurer, reported that the General Fund has \$2,563.08 and the Scholarship Fund has \$10,298.83.

## **Officer Reports:**

1<sup>st</sup> VP/Programs – Jay Garbus reported that the May meeting will be devoted to awarding four (4) JROTC \$1,000 Scholarships to area graduating seniors. The September speaker will be Larry Dandridge, Vietnam Veteran and author. Larry will bring his books to the meeting for sale to members. All proceeds from the sale of his books go to support the Veteran's Administration (VA), Fisher House, Charleston, SC.

**2**<sup>nd</sup> **VP/Recruiting and Retention** - Tim Dremann called for members to be on the lookout for any new potential members.

**3rd VP/Legislative Affairs – Gloria Scienski** reported that on April 13<sup>th</sup> a delegation of North Carolina MOAA state members traveled to Washington, D.C. to "Storm the Hill". Major items addressed were (1) reduced level of recent pay raises and (2) shifting of TRICARE costs onto the backs of military members. Gloria once again reminded members to answer the call from MOAA National Legislative Affairs email system and pre-printed letters enclosed in the monthly "Officers Magazine" for input to our legislators. Harley Ellinger, NC MOAA Council 3<sup>rd</sup> VP for Legislative Affairs relayed information from the NC Quarterly Council Meeting in Kill Devil Hill April 1-2. The guest speaker was MOAA's Deputy Director of Governmental Affairs, CDR Rene Campos (Ret). She addressed proposed changes in TRICARE and the status of VA improvements efforts. One item that got Harley's attention was that from 2006 to 2015 TRICARE Costs have been reduced by 40%. This reduction has been created by beneficiaries getting their maintenance prescriptions via the mail order system, Express Scripts. He also reported that state MOAA representatives will "Storm the Hill" in Raleigh on May 11<sup>th</sup>.

Members have volunteered to handle delivery and presentation of the awards. Larry thanked those who have volunteered and advised that he still has six awards needing to be delivered.
- **d.** Ron Morgan advised members that the JROTC Scholarship Fund Golf Tournament Committee is meeting on April 26<sup>th</sup> at 4:45 p.m. at Olde Sycamore Golf Plantation. All members are encouraged to help with this very important Chapter effort.

These coins will also be presented to speakers as a memento. Ron Morgan then presented the day's speaker, Tres Jones, with the first challenge coin.
- g. Gary Aljets, member of the Mecklenburg Veterans Council reported that Charlotte Bridge Home meets the fourth Thursday of each month at 8 a.m. at the Dilworth Grill.
