Maj Gen Al Flowers, USAF, Ret, will be our speaker, using the Zoom capability from San Antonio. His formal biography is attached to the Newsletter...but that does not tell the full story! General Flowers is a native North Carolinian with many family members in the state. He was raised in a "sharecropper" environment and learned the value of hard work and family values early on. He joined the AF right out of high school to escape poverty and gain opportunity. Through talent, hard work, mentors, a solid religious foundation, and wonderful spouse, he went up the promotion chain to E-7 and a commission. He retired as an 0-8 with a wide range of leadership assignments

in financial, and training/education billets at base, Major Command, Component Command, and Air Staff/Secretariate levels.

The General retired in 2012 after 46+ years of continuous service making him the longest serving Airman in AF history and the longest serving African American in defense history. All and Ida have one son; Al Jr is a BGen in the AF Medical Service Corps; two grandkids (one at the USAFA; the other in the Corps of Cadets at TX A&M). The legacy goes on!

The General penned a book, post-retirement, Refection of a Servant Leader, which is a must read and inspiration to parents, children, and grandchildren, as well as JROTC and ROTC cadets. He is in demand as a speaker across the spectrum of leadership gatherings and serves on a myriad of Boards of Directors. Gen Flowers presentation is entitled: The Legacy We Receive; The Legacy We Live; The Legacy We Leave!

<u>LEGISLATIVE ISSUES</u>.-The Major Richard Star Act has reached a milestone goal of 290 co-sponsors in the House — the threshold for it to be placed on the chamber's consensus calendar. This significant accomplishment, along with ongoing efforts in the Senate, show clear progress in MOAA's focused efforts and teamwork with fellow service organizations through The Military Coalition, to expand concurrent receipt to more than 50,000 combat-injured veterans who lose a dollar of retirement pay for every dollar of VA benefits they receive.

HELP SUPPORT MILITARY FAMILY ACCESS TO MENTAL HEALTH CARE

Help MOAA build support for H.R. 4824, the Stop Copay Overpay Act, which would reduce TRICARE copays for mental health visits and address the financial barrier to accessing mental health services.

URGE YOUR SENATORS TO SUPPORT LEGISLATION HALTING CUTS TO MILITARY MEDICINE

Please contact your senators and urge them to support H.R. 7900 Sec. 780, which would halt medical billet cuts for three years and increase congressional oversight and DoD reporting.

Major General Alfred K. Flowers, USAF, Ret (Biography)

Major General Retired, Alfred K. Flowers is President, KAL-46 Consulting, Author of *Reflections of a Servant Leader* and former Chief Operations Officer and Senior Strategic Advisor for two San Antonio minority owned business. He is the former Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Budget or simply said The Air Force Budget Director where he was responsible for \$170 Billion Dollars of Air Force funds. He currently serves on seven non-profit boards where he is the chairman of two and vice-chairman of one.

Following high school graduation, he enlisted in the United States Air Force at the age of seventeen. After completing basic military training at Lackland Air Force Base (AFB) in San Antonio, Texas, he was assigned as a supply warehouseman at Grand Forks AFB in North Dakota followed by a year at Da Nang AB, Vietnam and five other assignments prior to 1975. He received his A.A. degree from Thomas Edison University, B.S. Degree from Southern Illinois University, and master's degrees from Ball State and The National Defense University. In 1978, after thirteen years of enlisted service, Gen Flowers attended Officer Training School where he was a distinguished graduate and commissioned a Second Lieutenant. He served as a budget officer at several Air Force bases, Chief of Budget at Headquarters Air Combat Command, Director of Budget Programs HQ USAF, and Chief Financial Officer, HQ Air Education and Training Command and The United States Special Operations Command, J-8. He Commanded the Holms Center at Maxwell AFB, Alabama and The Second Air Force at Keesler AFB, Mississippi. In 2009, he was appointed as The Deputy Assistant Secretary of budget in the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force. On 1 January 2012, after forty-six years and five months of service, he retired from the United States Air Force, making him the longest-serving airman in Air Force history, the longest serving African American in defense history, and the longest serving continuous active-duty member in the history of The United States Department of Defense.


His military recognitions include two Distinguished Service Medals, the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit with oak leaf cluster and the Defense Meritorious Service Medal plus seventeen other decorations. Gen Flowers served on the board of directors for the Army and Air Force Exchange Service, the Air Force Aid Society and the Air Force Services Agency and is currently serving on seven boards as Chairman, Vice Chairman and Director. Gen Flowers was inducted into the Air Education and Training Command Order of The Sword on 6 April 2012 making him the 224th Air Force inductee since 1967. He was also inducted into The Order of The Long Leaf Pine by the Governor of North Carolina in August 2016. Additionally, he received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Air Force Association, 1 March 2019. On 28 August 2020 he was inducted as an Air Force Officer Training School Distinguished Alumni. He received the U.S. Air Force Distinguished Public Service Award in October 2020. He is married to Ida M. Flowers, and they have one son, BG Alfred K. Flowers, Jr., USAF, MSC.
