<u>LEGISLATIVE NOTES</u>- Advocacy is a very important component of the mission of MOAA. During the month of April, the Advocacy team at MOAA Headquarters conducted "Advocacy in Action", which is the name of the Advocacy campaign designed to bring Congressional attention to issues of importance to veterans and military retirees. This year the campaign was in person in Washington, D.C. in late April as representatives of MOAA from across the country assembled to meet with members of Congress.

This year there are two issues of greatest importance. First is an effort to restore the military Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) to cover 100% of expenses. In a plan to save DOD money, BAH was reduced following the 2015 National Defense Authorization Act by 1% per year for the next 5 years. Consequently, an E-5 with dependents will now spend \$1332 a year out of pocket. An O-3 with dependents will pay \$1596 per year. It is time to rescind these cuts, especially as inflation continues to affect military pay adversely.

The second initiative is to urge the restoration of thousands of brick-and-mortar pharmacies to the TRICARE system. A new pharmacy contract from the Defense Health Agency (DHA) has caused the nationwide pharmacy network to be cut by 25%. This is mostly harmful to TRICARE eligibles living in rural areas, or who are elderly or who are dealing with serious medical conditions.

How can you help? First, inside the April issue of "Military Officer" magazine from MOAA are preprinted letters to Senators Schumer and McConnell as well as to Congressmen McCarthy and Jeffries. Please sign and mail these letters. Even more impactful would be a personally written message to your own Congressional representatives. 

<u>Membership Requirements:</u> Commissioned and Warrant Officers of the eight uniformed services (Army, Navy, Air Force, Space Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and U.S. Public Health Service) and the reserve and other components of these services may become regular members.

Widows and widowers of any deceased individual, who would, if living, are eligible for membership.
