LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS - Legislative Notes Charles A. (Tony) Castle MD, FACOG

April is a very important month for MOAA Advocacy as this is the time of year when MOAA plans Advocacy in Action or AIA. AIA is an annual program in which MOAA representatives from across the



country meet with members of Congress or their staff members to present our Legislative goals for the current year.

For 2024 there are three Legislative priorities. These are 1) Pass the Major Richard Star Act to support combat injured veterans, 2) Restore the Basic Allowance for Housing to 100% of the community standard, and 3) Protect Tricare for Life as a benefit for retired veterans. Further details regarding these issues are available in the April issue of the MOAA magazine, <u>Military Officer</u>.

SPRING ADVOCACY CAMPAIGN - By Tricia Vinson

During the long session there were six veteran connected bills that made the crossover list that might be easy 'wins' during the 2024 short session. To be considered during the short session or election year session, a bill needs to have been passed by either the House or the Senate which places the bill on the crossover list. There are exceptions of course, corrections to the budget, or verbiage, or an emergency budget issue.

The veteran related bills that made the crossover list for this short session include: HB178 Maintenance of State Veterans Cemeteries; HB 296 Adopt Veteran's History Museum; HB427 Honor Women Veteran's Plate; HB463 NC Farmland & amp; Military Protection Act; HB487 POW/MIA Flags/State Bldgs. & amp; Schools and HB 492 Post NC Veteran Benefits.

As previously mentioned, our primary focus (#1 consideration) is the emergency closure of the Fayetteville State Veterans Home on 1 February. Since it was a sudden or unexpected closure, it fits the definitions for consideration during the short session. The Joint Legislature's Oversight Committee for General Government has met on 30 Jan & amp; 27 Feb & amp; will meet next on 26 March. They directed a facility inspection conducted on 6 Feb. Deputy Secretary Pierce has been the DMVA's point person in these meetings.

MOAA DATABASE TRANSITION TIMELINE AND IMPACT

As a reminder, the transition of MOAA's database began March 31. Council and chapter leaders do not have access to the Committee Module or NRT Report as of April 1 until on or about April 22.

MOAA members received this <u>update on MOAA's system upgrade</u> and how this might impact their access to information during the transition. This message also explains how this transition will impact logging into MOAA.org, with the "email of record" replacing usernames when accessing online accounts. Members should <u>contact the Member Service Center</u> if they have multiple emails on file with MOAA to determine the email of record. Passwords will not change under the new system, and access to <u>MOAA's Legislative Action Center</u> will not be affected. Further instructions on using the new system will be available in the coming weeks.
