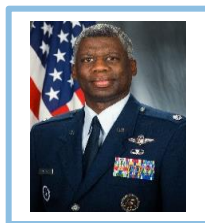

LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS – LTC Vinson, 3rd VP Council of Chapters - Just listened to the House committee meeting today which was held so that Secretary Martin could attend and address the committee and answer their questions. Short meeting, mostly a return to the legislature and his past history with initiating the committee back in 2005. A little on his background.

FYI & SA. Excellent dialog. He is currently a gimp, having broken his foot on a vacation. So travel and moving around is not easy, but easy to joke about. Very gracious about his military background, jokes about being better able to understand Army vs AF, but willing to have translations to learn.

Question asked about the State Home in Fayetteville. He said what is done is done, but he is coming in with fresh eyes, and since all that were in the home are being taken care of, he will take the time to learn in order to come up with best solution forward. Don't expect a quick answer, but he plans on doing a terrain walk (maybe in a wheelchair) since he needs to get his eyes on the home and what is there to get a better understanding. Not an engineer so will be looking to get some experts and their opinions so the path forward is unknown but he will be deliberate in his recommendation. The DMVA is paying some cost differentials and he expects that will continue so no veteran will pay more for being moved out of the home. May combine a trip to the home with a visit to Sandhill cemetery to see how it is progressing and issues that are still there. Being a gimp will be an issue, but will not stop him from going or seeing what he needs to see.

There was a question on 100% veteran disability & property tax. Said that is a legislative issue, but understands the needs of those that served our country and the local community uses of those funds and that there is a balancing act. He understands the issues. There is an overall desire to have a military and veteran friendly state and that the income tax update from a couple of years ago was definitely known by all the veterans and military that are deciding where they will move. NC has done well, but can most likely do more. Will help to know what other states are also doing and see if there are things we can do to also improve and make improvements to retain highly trained military into the civilian workforce that have clearances. So doing well, but can do better and he will like to work on that.

A discussion on VA and medical care but mostly in general terms. He appreciates what the VA does and wants to continue to ensure that NC does partnership efforts for the veteran community here.

MOAA DATABASE TRANSITION TIMELINE AND IMPACT

As a reminder, the transition of MOAA's database began March 31. Council and chapter leaders do not have access to the Committee Module or NRT Report as of April 1 until on or about April 22.

MOAA members received this [update on MOAA's system upgrade](#) and how this might impact their access to information during the transition. This message also explains how this transition will impact logging into MOAA.org, with the "email of record" replacing usernames when accessing online accounts. Members should [contact the Member Service Center](#) if they have multiple emails on file with MOAA to determine the email of record. Passwords will not change under the new system, and access to [MOAA's Legislative Action Center](#) will not be affected. Further instructions on using the new system will be available in the coming weeks.
