# **NEWSLETTER APRIL 2025**



President's message Greetings Leaders

Our Nation celebrates Memorial Day this weekend. Many civic organizations participate in honoring the sacrifices and loss of

those who served and died in theservice of our Nation. One of the first Memorial Day celebrations was observed by newly freed slaves on May 1, 1865, in Charleston, South Carolina.

These citizens honored the dead by singing hymns and placing flowers on the graves of Union troops who died in the Civil War. Union General John A. Logan called for an official nationwide day of remembrance on May 30, 1868. In 1950, Congress passed a resolution requesting that the president issue a proclamation calling on Americans to observe Memorial Da as a day of prayer for permanent peace.

However, it wasn't until 1968 that Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May. This act became an official federal holiday in 1971. This year, Aaron Harper of the Veterans Bridge Home invited our Chapter to join in their annual Memorial Day Remembrance at Cedar Grove Cemetery on Monday, May 26, 2025, at 10 AM.

This special event provides an opportunity for neighbors, veterans, and civic leaders to honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our Nation. The program will include a Color Guard, invocation, music, wreath-laying, and a roll call of honored veterans interred at Cedar Grove. Cedar Grove Cemetery is located at the University Park Creative Arts School, 2400 Hildebrand Street, Charlotte, NC, 28216. I hope that your schedule will allow you to attend. All Chapter members are invited to attend our Zoom meeting on Wednesday, June 11, 2025, at 7 PM. This important meeting will detail information on future meeting locations and dates, as well as vital information on our Fall meetings. Please attend and participate in this meeting.

<u>Membership Requirements:</u> Commissioned and Warrant Officers of the eight uniformed services ( Army, Navy, Air Force, Space Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and U.S. Public Health Service) and the reserve and other components of these services may become regular members.

Widows and widowers of any deceased individual, who would, if living, are eligible for membership.
